- I. Welcome and brief updates
  - a. Updates on the Impacts of Helene on Western NC
    - i. Assist students in alternatives to withdrawal by encouraging faculty, to provide flexibility, and trying to offer some options for students; incompletes are available but cause other challenges.
    - ii. SAFE Fund through Student Affairs provides up to \$1,000 for unavoidable financial hardship or natural disasters.
  - b. New student projections and enrollment targets Spring 2025-Fall 2027
    - i. Fall 2024 enrollment is up! Up by nine students and exceeded our goal by 30 students! Good work, everyone!
    - ii. Online students increased at a higher rate. Most units saw online hours increase.
    - iii. We need to provide revised three-year enrollment goals by November 5, 2024. Associate deans will work with programs to establish them.
    - iv. Units will provide numbers of new students not already enrolled in a program, i.e., students in a PBC program should only count if they're not in a concurrent program.
    - v. In response to a question about marketing resources: Enrollment Management has some printed resources, and GRS has limited items to give away at conferences, etc.

## II. Admissions updates

- a. Direct admissions
  - i. Outstanding undergraduates are great resources, offering current undergraduate students who meet your minimum to be preadmitted before they apply; contact your admission specialist.
  - ii. Can alleviate barriers to applying for the highest standard students.
  - iii. Programs must set criteria for holistic admissions.
  - iv. Consider enrollment deposits for limited enrollment programs.
- b. ETS session on using rubrics for holistic admissions.
  - i. Free webinar with ETS regarding specific rubrics for programs to consider things to go into admissions decisions.
- c. Application fee waiver process change
  - i. Beginning immediately, applicants who use an application fee waiver (of \$65 from the program, i.e., waiver code) will be required to complete all parts of the application prior to submission.
- d. AMP revision preview
  - i. AMP allows undergraduate students to earn credit for a baccalaureate and master's degree simultaneously.

- ii. Currently, students must tell us early in their careers so we can double-count these credits. There are several other challenges with the system we have in place, so we're proposing a change.
- iii. What standard for excellence is appropriate for these students so that we can justify awarding double credit?
- III. Enrolled student updates
  - a. Reminder about changes to probation and dismissal
    - i. "Three-strike" policy, where any combination of three grades below B (or two grades of U of F) will result in dismissal.
    - ii. The policy committee is still refining grade forgiveness.
    - iii. Fall 2024 Degree Clearance and Degree Works updates.
    - iv. Friday 11:59 is the deadline to withdraw without penalty. ITS updates start at 5 pm, which has the potential to disrupt this. Affected students should reach out to us ASAP after the deadline.
